

CAREER RESOURCES

The WorkLife Office, Health Promotion, and Health4U units have been realigned to form the Health Promotion and Engagement Team. Along with The Resource Center for Persons with Disabilities, these two teams will comprise Health Promotion, Engagement, Accessibility, and Accommodation (HPEAA) within <u>University Health and Wellbeing</u> (UHW). Due to the reintegration of WorkLife into University Health and Wellbeing, we are unable to conduct consultations at this time. CAREER SERVICES NETWORK

- The MSU Career Services Network helps students and recent alumni (within two years of graduation) develop and articulate the key competencies necessary to make informed decisions and take steps toward their career goals.
- The <u>Career Handbook</u> has informative information in it about resumes, cover letters, search strategy, interviews, references, recommendations, etc. that anyone can utilize.

OFFICE OF FACULTY AND ACADEMIC STAFF DEVELOPMENT

• The Office of Faculty and Academic Staff Development (formerly the Academic Advancement Network) works with all faculty, academic staff, and academic administrators at Michigan State University as they join the university, establish professional trajectories, and move through various stages of review, promotion, and growth.
